This is a short report of COMPSUD activities since the last meeting in Athens, 6 November 2015, 9.30-10.30 at the Divani Caravel Hotel. The report will be briefly presented during the session of COMPSUD that will take place on November 22<sup>nd</sup> from 10.00-12.00 at the Hilton Park Hotel.

The last half hour of the meeting will be dedicated to preparing/coordinating the interventions of the Members of Parliament at the afternoon session at the Cypriot Parliament where 2-3 minute statements can be made on:

- How can Parliaments of the Mediterranean region support the implementation of the Action Plan of the Mediterranean Strategy for Education for Sustainable Development?
- What Joint actions among Parliaments of different Euro-Mediterranean countries can be taken in support of the Action Plan?

We invite you as members of the Circle (or interested/candidates) to also contribute with any actions and activities that you have done during this period in support of COMPSUD's promotion.

## **COMPSUD** participation in international and regional processes:



The Mediterranean Commission on Sustainable Development (MCSD) is an advisory multi-stakeholder body to the Contracting Parties (COP) of the Barcelona Convention. At the 19th meeting of the COP (Athens, February 2016) COMPSUD, represented by its Chair Dionysia Avgerinopoulou, was formally approved as a member of the MCSD and at the 17th meeting of the MCSD that took place in Athens on 4-7 July 2017, was elected as Vice President of the Steering Committee till the next MCSD meeting in June 2019.

COMPSUD concerns were transmitted to the **Union for the Mediterranean** (UfM) Ministerial Meeting on Water in Malta on 27 April 2017 where Ministers and other Heads of Delegations agreed on a new 'Water Agenda' for the region.

The Chair of COMPSUD was nominated and elected as Vice-Chair of the Steering Committee of the Global Water Partnership in December 2016.

COMPSUD was active in both the 22nd United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP22) which took place in November 2016 in Marrakech, as well as the MEDCOP22 (July 2016, Tangier).

The Secretary General of COMPSUD continues to be active in the European Parliament (EP) representing it on the Board of the European Environment Agency. In this capacity, he has participated in hearings of the EP and introduced Mediterranean issues on Sustainable Development, Education, Civil Society participation and the science-policy interface in the relevant agendas.

Furthermore, the messages and positions of COMPSUD are taken into consideration and transmitted by MIO-ECSDE and GWP-Med to:

- the Steering Group of the Horizon 2020 Initiative for a Cleaner Mediterranean
- the Barcelona Convention meetings and expert groups
- the UfM Water Experts Group
- the UfM Expert Group on Climate Change
- the UfM Environment Expert Group
- the World Water Week, where in 2017 the Chair of COMPSUD presented the circle and ask spoke about the role of Members of Parliament in water financing.





**COMPSUD** (Circle of Mediterranean Parliamentarians for Sustainable **Development**) is a light regional network of Parliamentarians that promotes dialogue, exchange of information and sharing of knowledge on sustainable development and water issues in the region. Formed in the wake of the Johannesburg Summit (2002), it operates with the technical administrative and assistance of the Mediterranean Information Office for Environment, Culture and Sustainable Development (MIO-ECSDE) and the Global Water Partnership-Mediterranean (GWP-Med). It regularly holds dialogue events. The informal status and light function of COMPSUD has proven effective in securing interest and participation of competent representatives even during times of political conflict and social turmoil in the Region.

COMPSUD's capacity in water, climate change, coastal erosion, Man and the biosphere reserves and other protected areas, Education for Sustainable Development, etc. are readily available to its Members. If the Members of COMPSUD take relevant initiatives in their countries (e.g. on the Mediterranean Strategy Education for Sustainable Development) COMPSUD the Secretariat can provide expertise and support them in promoting important issues.


