


Five regional environmental ECE conventions


INECE

- The protection of transboundary waters
- Transboundary Effects of Industrial Accidents
- Environmental Impact Assessment in a Transboundary Context
- Long-range Transport of Air Pollution
- Public information and participation in decision making (Aarhus)

The Water Convention



- Signed on 17 March 1992
- Entered into force on 6
 October 1996
- Protocol on Water and Health adopted in 1999, entered into force in 2005
- Protocol on Civil Liability adopted in 2003



Main obligations under the Convention



- Protection of transboundary waters by preventing, controlling and reducing transboundary impacts
- Reasonable and equitable use of transboundary waters
- Obligation to cooperate through agreements and joint institutions
- => Overall objective of sustainability

Guidance on Public Participation (2000)

- Participation of NGOs as observers on the basis of reasonable and clear criteria
- Procedures for oversight (transparency) and a role for the public in monitoring of implementation with regard to obligations
- PP in the development of plans etc for catchment areas and in the preparation of agreements
- JB should receive and consider information from the public
- JB should have a PP strategy and focal point

Aarhus Convention

Almaty Guidelines on Promoting the Application of the Principles of the Aarhus Convention in International Forums (2005):

Access to docs, written statements, oral comments of the "public concerned"

Examples of mechanisms

- Rules for observer status developed in Commissions on the Oder, Scheldt, Meeuse/Maas, Danube, Rhine, Sava
- Working groups for cooperation with NGOs: Russian-Estonian Commission
- River-citizen forums, stakeholder conferences: Okavango, US-Mexico, Danube, Peipsi Lake
- Websites, media events, publications:
 Central Asia, Mosel and Saar, Romania
