ARTICLE 1


Rationale for the Regional Plan

Marine litter may have significant implications for the marine and coastal environm global level. These impacts are environmental, economic, health and safety and cultural, rooted in our prevailing production and consumption patterns. The problem originates mostly from land-based activities and sea-based activities, as well as lack of governmental financial resources, general lack of understanding of the public's co-responsibility, and the optimisation of the application of legal enforcement systems could limit pollution.


2. The rationale for the preparation of this Regional Plan is to improve the quality of the marine and coastal environment in accordance with the provisions of the LBS Protocol and to achieve the goals set by the decisions of the 17th meeting of the Contracting Parties in 2012, Decision IG.20/4: "Implementing MAP ecosystem approach roadmap: Mediterranean Ecological and Operational Objectives, Indicators and Timetable for implementing the ecosystem approach roadmap" and Decision IG 20/10: "Adoption of the Strategic Framework for Marine Litter management," at the considerable lower cost than with the no action scenario.

Inspire Contracting parties in taking further actions at national level





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### How to make the measure sustainable?

Take adequate measures to increase the cup reuse:

- Include the reusable cups scheme as mandatory in concessions and permits = template document developed & shared with municipalities.
- Ban/phase out of SUP in beach bars and festivals = include this measure in specific articles of the regulatory laws of the Natural Park.
- Formal engagement with businesses located in MPAs to promote SUPsfree commitments = become a plastic free NP or a plastic free beach bar.
- Labelling = implementation of a certificate for responsible beach bar initiative, engaging businesses and awarding them with a plastic freecertificate.







## How to make the measure sustainable?

How to maintain the Deposit Return Scheme (DRS) implemented in the NP?



- Engage a broaden type of participating businesses to include a wider range of high attendance venues, particularly those selling cans and SUP beverage.
- A major involvement of participating municipalities & their local communication channels to increase local users of the scheme.
- Assure budget from NP for maintenance of the machines and cover the logistics costs.





## **SOLASTALGIA?**

Solastalgia (/spla'stældʒa/) is a neologism, formed by the combination of the Latin words sōlācium (comfort) and the Greek root -algia (pain, suffering, grief), that describes a form of emotional or existential distress caused by environmental change.
